Aside from his 13 year tenure as Director of advanced lung disease and Pulmonary Hypertension Interstitial Lung disease at North Shore University Hospital in Long Island, Talwar is also a clinical scientist. As an Associate Investigator for the Center for Heart & Lung Research at the The Feinstein Institute for Medical Research, he works on translational research in pulmonary medicine with a focus on pulmonary hypertension and advanced

lung disease.

A three time recipient of the Empire Clinical Research Investigator Program (ECRIP) award, Dr. Talwar works to explore the various co-morbidities that affect patients with pulmonary hypertension and interstitial lung disease. By taking a close look at patient mental health and quality of life, his research provides a holistic approach to restorative medicine. Talwar has over 100 publications and more than 20 chapter books on Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension.
